"We have met the enemy and he is us" Pogo via Walt Kelly

- 1. No one is in charge
- 2. Managerial Accountability versus governance accountability
- 3. the UN as a club, run by its members, not a global government
 - The Secretary-General, a cross between a Pope and a deputy minister
 - According to Article 97, the chief administrative officer, not CEO, much less President
 - The Security Council, not a cabinet and not accountable in practice to the Secretary General or to the General Assembly
 - o Representativeness versus efficiency,
 - o But effectiveness?
 - The General Assembly—seems more a rabble than a parliament—but the institution of the weak
 - o The NAM and the G77 and the spoilers
 - Payers and Payees
 - o The Swedish Initiative
- 4. Near total lack of consensus
 - North and South priorities: development versus security
 - Arabs versus Israelis
 - Iran and Israel
 - Darfur and the Congo, inter alia, (and no political will)
